Welcome to Our Early Years Newsletter

This is a new venture to help inform you directly of your child's learning. You will be able to read about the learning taking place, the plans we have and a chance for us to ask for your support in your child's first or second year at St Michael's.

It has been great to welcome our new starters to Nursery, George, Gracie, Ethan, Grace, Matilda, Jake and Frankii. You have settled very well, and we hope you enjoy time with your new friends and teachers.

Outdoor Learning

You may have noticed lots of changes to our EYFS outdoor learning environment. We are very lucky to have this space and the children have been very excited about the transformation of their outdoor area. The outdoor provision is used all year round, and at St Michael's we are passionate about developing opportunities for children to not only learn inside but outside too. Let's take a look to see what developments and transformations are taking place for our children:

- The new bamboo fencing gives a more natural look to the outdoors.
- Creating a new planting area. This will allow the children greater exploration, making it a very tactile garden to investigate, plant and grow.
- The mud kitchen has re-located
- The water station on the wall

We aim to provide opportunities indoors and outdoors to enable the children to develop as independent and confident learners, as this stage within school form the building blocks for the rest of the life.

Phonics and Reading

We read lots of different stories to the children, but we always have a focus book which we link our learning opportunities to.

The focus book in **nursery** after half term with be '**Jasper's Beanstalk'** and children will plant their own beans and watch how they grow and change.

In reception the focus book will be 'The Hungry Caterpillar' and we will have real caterpillars in the classroom that we will see transform into butterflies.

Please support your child's learning at home by identifying sounds in the home and garden, reading the phonemes and tricky words provided and sound talking words as much as possible so that they can practice blending sounds. E.g. "Please come and s-i-t down?" Please keep reading with and to your child as much as possible.
